We are only into the third month of the year and already many exciting things have already been accomplished.

Association Croquet has completed their night doubles with Division 4 winning the pennant and Division 3 coming third. Saturday Pennants, which is a doubles competition, has began for both Association and Golf Croquet in January and will continue throughout the year. Golf Croquet has enter four teams in the Autumn pennants, the most teams we have ever had. Congratulations to Lynne Hughes and Roger Harris who won the SACA Golf Croquet Doubles 9+.

We have accomplished a lot of maintenance around the Club. The inverter for the solar panels has been replaced, the lawn lights on courts 1, 2 & 3 repaired but the most exciting thing is the lights on court 4 have been replaced by LED lights. Please come out at night and use court 4 as the lighting is magnificent and it is far more cost effective to light this lawn than the other three lawns. We have also bought a set of Quadway hoops for court 4 to support the Golf Croquet players in their challenge to win a pennant this year.

We are about to begin the *69th Association Croquet Interstate Carnival* in Adelaide, 14th - 25th March. Our club will be hosting the Men's and Women's Championships from the 17th - 20th March and the Eire Cup from the 21st - 25th March. Please come, watch and support the highly skilled croquet players from our state and interstate. You may have noticed William and his group of many men, with the support of David Watchman and Ron McBride preparing our lawns and facilities so that we can present our club as the best in the country.

This year is the South Australian Croquet Association Centenary. A special event will be run at Hutt Road on Sunday, 6 May from 10 am - 4 pm.

Committee Information

Key Audit reminder - this audit is ongoing and you will find Dan, William or Tamara tapping you on the shoulder if you have a key in the near future.

Court Lighting - as the President mentioned previously, the committee recently approved the maintenance of lights on all courts. This work includes the repair of the lights on courts 1-3; and the upgrade of LED lights on court 4. The lights removed from court 4 have been stored as replacement lights for the other courts if required, as these lights cannot be sourced anymore. The upgrade of lights to LED on court 4 was only possible due to a grant we received from the City of Prospect. Thanks to Sue LePoidevin and the President for their hard work in acquiring this grant.

Quadway Hoops - the Club has also purchased a set of *Quadway* hoops, which will be used on court 4. The Committee received a number of requests from members to purchase a set of Quadway hoops, so members could practice using them at the Club. A number of clubs now use these hoops for competitions and members felt they had an unfair advantage when they couldn't train for competitions using the same equipment. The Club will borrow and additional three sets of Quadway hoops for the Eire Cup in March, as this is an requirement from Croquet SA.


Notes from the AC Captain

Notes from the Bar Member




The Club has purchased some *Cool Towels* for members, which can be purchased from your friendly bar member. If you can believe what it reads on the web: "Stay cool and dry on the court with a cooling towel. These towels are made from a hyper-evaporative material, are light and can be placed around your neck or over your head. Simply soak the towel in cold water and wring out. It provides an instant relief in hot weather, wicks sweat away from your body and helps prevent heat stress and fatigue". There are only two colours - blue and green, but please put your name on your towel to indicate it is yours. A number of members have tested these and found them very good. The cost is only \$7 (less than the cost of two coffees when you dine out).

69th Association Croquet Interstate Carnival - Croquet SA will be hosting the 69th Association Croquet Interstate Carnival from the 14-25 March. It will consist of three events - The Gold Medal, Men's and Women's singles and the Eire Cup. Games will be held across a variety of venues, including our Cub, who will host the Eire Cup from the 17-20 March. History of the EIRE Cup. The Interstate Cup, which bears the inscription "Irish International Eire Cup", was won in Dublin, Ireland, in 1937 by an Australian team consisting of C.J. Miller (C), J.C. Windsor, Miss A.B.Morrison and E.M.Hunt. The trophy was brought to Australia and kept at Victoria's headquarters. After World War II, when interstate play was resumed, the cup was awarded in interstate competition in

Sydney in 1942. When the Australian Croquet Council (ACC) was formed in 1949, the cup became its property. The Eire Cup as it has become known, is in the form of a silver rosebowl. In 1951 its value was estimated at 100 pounds. South Australia has won the Eire Cup 32 times (of the 68 times played): in 1952, 1954-56, 1962, 1966, 1969-78, 1980-82, 1985-88, 1991, 1995-2001 and 2003. The Interstate Championships are conducted by a rotation of States, and are held at the same time as the Australian Men's and Women's Singles Championships.
