Covid-19 a continuing story: are you vaxed?

At the time of writing the shadow of COVID-19 and the latest, even more infectious OMICRON variant, forced the club to review its approach to vaccination and participation in our range of activities. It was rightly decided to consult all members about what response to adopt, to shape our policy and practice in the light of feedback given. Most members wanted a clear directive, which was quickly communicated to everyone. The reasonable assumption was that all members and casual visitors to the club would be fully vaccinated or had intention to do so. This was important so that as far as possible we avoided a 'policing' approach. Except to invite everyone to show some proof of being vaccinated, on a 'one-off' basis, we wanted to base our club policy and practice on mutual trust and good will. Time will tell if the softer approach has worked.

Calling all dog owners

In keeping with the consultative approach to important club matters, the committee surveyed members' opinions about bringing dogs to the club. Most members agreed that it was okay to bring dogs to the club on condition they were properly managed and not likely to become a nuisance. This is a fair and reasonable outcome, while recognising that some members are attached to their dogs, and they should not be parted by club rules.

Calling a temporary halt to external bookings

Given the continuing COVID situation, the club has had to put on hold some other activities, notably casual hiring our facilities and volunteer support to other groups and organisations. All these measures are regarded as an interim measure. The same applies to undertaking a strategic plan for the club, which needs to wait for more certain times when long-term thinking is possible.

January golf croquet club competition

Meanwhile, no doubt the politicians would call it resilience, the club organised a very successful internal golf croquet competition for Friday evenings in January. As usual Sue applied her tact and knowledge of playing handicaps to create mixed ability pairs on what might be called 'the level playing field' principle. Well done and thank you for a wonderful effort, Sue. Thanks to everyone that played and supported a popular event, which is reported in more detail later.

John has successfully played in State and National level competitions and in 1995 was ranked no. 2 in Australia. His love of the game has been evidenced in the significant work he has done through coaching at club level and State Teams. He has contributed to re-writing AC Coaching Courses

and manuals and published booklets on various aspects of AC. John has been very supportive of

NACC players through coaching and encouragement especially for new players. His extensive knowledge and expertise is highly regarded and his significant contribution to the sport is highly valued.

Colin Pickering

Colin began playing croquet in 1973 at Fitzroy Croquet Club. As an avid sportsman he was a very quick learner who thoroughly enjoyed this game at which he went on to become a Champion, playing in State, National and International competition representing Australia on many occasions. At club level he was always keen to encourage new members by providing assistance and encouragement through coaching. He was involved with administration of the Club as President 2007-2009. Some of his significant achievements include the following; Between 1977 & 2000 Colin won nine State Singles and Open State Singles Championships, represented SA thirteen times in Eire Cup team, winning each time. He was winner of Vic Open Singles Championship twice. Nationally, he represented Australia five times in MacRobertson Shield Competition and Trans-Tasman Competitions, Aust. Open Singles Champion three times and Aust. Doubles champion and Men's Singles Champion 1998. Colin represented Aus. at World Croquet Federation Championships five times and played in numerous invitational events in America and France. At his peak Colin's AC ranking was 12th in the world. In 2000 Colin resigned from International competition but continued to play the game he loved at his local Club which became North Adelaide when Fitzroy Club amalgamated with Prospect Club. In 2000 Colin was awarded the Australian Sports Medal and Life Membership of Croquet SA. Colin has contributed enormously to the game of Croquet through outstanding playing achievements but also through significant involvement within the Club that he played for. He is truly an iconic player who sadly is no longer with us.

She has coached members at the Club both in AC and GC for many years together with actively supporting and

Shuna and Colin maintained fabulous historical records of the NACC during their time with us and have produced wonderful photo albums depicting the various events of the Club over the past 20 years. Shuna is to be acknowledged for her significant work in all areas of the NACC.

Iain served as the first President of the new Club for two terms and was a co-sponsor of the inaugural North Adelaide Croquet Games. Iain is an AC player who, while on management committee, supported the upgrading of the lawns to a standard that interstate AC players have praised. Our lawns remain the envy of many other clubs as this high standard of maintenance has continued with subsequent lawns groundsmen. Iain was proud to ensure the



ground was dressed and the flags halyards were correctly flown. Iain supported all fundraising efforts at the club with the Prospect Fair, sausage sizzles, recycling cans & bottles. Iain is a certified Coach for AC and regularly invited people to come & try croquet encouraging them to consider taking up the game he loves to play. AC achievements included; 2001 Div 4 Champion 2004 Div 3 Men's Champion of Champions 2004 Handicap champion. Unfortunately, an accident injury prevented Iain from competing in any further competitions but he has continued to play AC socially at the Club. Iain has been a loyal member of NACC, and acknowledges the strong fellowship which has always been and continues to be an important aspect of North Adelaide Croquet Club. Congratulations. Iain.
