AC Weekend Pennants 2022

The Pennants for this year have now drawn to a close. I'm delighted to announce that NACC has won very convincingly the Division 3, captained by Roger Harris. Our other two teams – Division 2 (5th), captained by Kevin Le Poidevin, and Division 4 (4th), captained by Barbara Stanley – strived valiantly all year but were not as successful.

Our Division 3 team will be awarded their winning flag at the SACA Presentations hosted at our NACC Clubrooms this coming Sunday (12 December). The team comprised: Lyn Booth (9 games), Kevin Le Poidevin (9 games), Ray Walter (9 games), Roger Harris (7 games), Janet Willshire (7 games), Barbara Stanley (2 games) and Catherine Bawden (1 game), with David Sincock (4 games) from Coromandel Valley Club filling in whenever required.

Colin Pickering North Adelaide Games

These annual Games, held in November each year, comprise two main tournaments:

- 1. **Invitation Singles**, where our Club invites a limited number of top male and female players to compete in a Round Robin competition over a weekend (and sometimes the preceding Friday evening). Entry fees allow for prizes for the Winner and Runner-Up in each of the Men's and Women's competitions, and the Men's and Women's winners names are added to a shield hanging in the NACC clubroom.
- 2. **Swiss Singles**, scheduled over three days, where players of any handicap can nominate to enter, and compete in four games against others around the same handicap. With handicaps weighted accordingly, every player has a fair chance of winning this event. Again, prizes are presented, this time for the Championship Winner and Runner-Up as well as for the Handicap Winner and Runner-Up.

This year, we were very fortunate that largely fine weather greeted the players for each event! The tournaments were played in excellent spirit and some very fine croquet was on show for many interested onlookers.

Invitation Singles results

This tournament was conducted on 25-27 November. Nine men and six women participated – seven from country clubs. The men's tournament was exciting with the results hanging in the balance until the end and winners decided by net hoops which were very close. Three won 6 games (and three won 5 games)! The three with 6 wins, in order, were Tim O'Leary (Coobowie, +69 nett hoops), David Short (Norwood, +67 nett hoops) and Mark Senior (Hyde Park, +65 nett hoops). In the women's tournament, Robyn Short (Coobowie) was the winner with 5 wins (+63 nett hoops), while the runner-up was Di Helier (Norwood) with 3 wins, and third was Shirley Howlett (Victor Harbor) with 2 wins.

Swiss Singles results

In this event held on 16-18 November, 20 players over a range of handicaps (from 1 to 18) participated, six from country clubs. In the *Championship*, the winner was Kevin Le Poidevin (North Adelaide) who was the only player to win all 4 games, while the Runner-up was Barry Jennings (Hyde Park) with 3 wins. In the *Handicap*, the winner was Greg Rowberry (Norwood) and the runner-up Tracey Sincock (Hyde Park). Other players with 3 wins included Rhonda Habner (Tumby Bay), Liz Mackenzie (Norwood) and Barry Jennings (Hyde Park).

We congratulate all these worthy winners – Tim, David, Robyn, Di, Kevin, Barry, Greg and Tracey. My sincere thanks to all participating players who made the tournaments such a success, and to all those North Adelaide Croquet Club members, who helped to feed players, provide excellent playing surfaces, set hoops each day and ensure the Games ran smoothly, including but not limited to:

Food – Barbara in particular, and also Norma Greig, ably assisted by Sue and accompanied by an army of helpers who formed somewhat of a 'congo line' of contributors every day, stocking the table over the five days and one evening of the two tournaments.
